A high standards UK following EU withdrawal

- Standards within the UK must be protected, strengthened and reinforced
- Best practice for rights and standards maintained or developed
- Ensuring associated policies and structural fundings
- Constitutional or legislative changes should not mean fewer rights
- No new governance gaps

Open and accountable lawmaking

- Respect for democratic processes, including the devolved nature of the UK constitution
- Clear limits and safeguards on executive power
- Robust parliamentary scrutiny at all levels with appropriate transparency and debate

A strong civil society voice across the UK

- Civil society organisations are active advocates in the public sphere
- Collaborative, consistent, open, effective, and accountable culture of government engagement
- Bridge between citizens and the State
- Views, interests, and evidence are heard by government
